# Asakusa

The retrospective streets relate the time when Tokyo was once called Edo.

The Sensoji Temple is visited by 20,000,000 worshipers each year. From the Grand Kaminarimon Gate enshrining Fujin (the God of Wind) and Raijin (the God of Thunder), walk along Nakamise Dori, and its preserved local atmosphere takes you back in time. You can see, touch and taste the spirit of Edo through Edo goods, kaminariokoshi (Japanese sweets), and traditional restaurants of sweets and soba (noodle). Then, go on to Asakusa Hana-yashiki, the retrospective amusement park with a history of about 150 years. Asakusa Entertainment Hall offers the fine art and techniques of the rakugo storyteller.



## Recommended Route through Asakusa

One-day course to visit the historical downtown and feel the spirit of Edo

- 1 Asakusa Sta. 3-min. walk
- 2 Nakamise 5-min. walk
- 3 Sensoji Temple 1-min. walk
- 4 Asakusajinja Shrine 5-min. walk
- 5 Amusement Park Asakusa Hana-yashiki 5-min. walk
- 6 Asakusa Entertainment Hall 7-min. walk
- 7 Tawaramachi Sta.
